


### JUNIORS:

## 2012 MN Go-Pher Sale



Dear fellow Hereford breeders:

It is with great enthusiasm that I write this nomination letter to you. I am truly excited and honored to be asked to help you all with this Sale that has so much tradition and history, as being one of the best state consignment sales in the country.

The Sales Committee, myself, as well as Ross Carlson and Jim Hanson have been working all summer to come up with some new ideas to try and help make our Sale even more successful than in the past, and I am truly excited to see how they might work.

The first thing we are going to do is to offer you, as the consigners, is the opportunity to put cattle in the sale that are not halter-broke. We have several reasons for doing this; first of all, we are hoping that if there are some people that want to consign, but haven't because they didn't have the experience with getting cattle ready, that this may encourage them to consign. The other thought is that we may have some breeders that have consigned in the past, but with kids moving away or work schedules getting more hectic or just plain getting older, that it has become impossible for them to continue participating in the Sale. We had also thought that perhaps it might encourage you to consign more bred females, which can be more of a challenge to halter-break as well. For those that are able to bring their cattle halter-broke, I encourage you to continue doing so.

We have also talked to a few young men about helping out a consigner who may not have the time or experience in getting cattle prepared for the Sale. I would encourage you to contact me, or the Sale Committee if you have any interest in this. We have also chosen to raise the entry fee for the Sale. We have done this for a few reasons, one being that like everything else, our expenses continue to increase as well. The other reason we chose to do this is that as we have moved away from a formal Selection Committee for the Sale, and that it would encourage you as consigners to not only consign your best animals, but follow through and bring them to Hutchinson in December. As I mentioned earlier, we are not having an official Selection Committee this year, but if we have someone who is a first time consignor or anyone wanting some advice, either myself or any of the Sale Committee would be happy to come to your place to help you.

We have chosen to allow substitutions for this years' Sale, but realize all animals are subject to being sifted upon arrival to the sale facility, by me or the Sale Committee. I would encourage you all to bring the best quality animals that you can. I would also ask that as we enter into this first year of bringing in cattle that are not broke, that you consider a few things. First, since they are not halter-broke, they will be difficult to get into the wash-rack at the sale sight, so please make every effort to keep them as clean as possible at home. The other thing to consider is that even though the cattle don't need to be halter-broke, they do need to be worked with so that they are as gentle as possible and are used to human interaction. I encourage you to either contact a neighboring fellow breeder, or one of the gentlemen we have lined up to get the cattle clipped before the sale so that they look presentable on arrival.

We are going to ask to limit the amount of bull entries to 4-5 head, and also we are always looking for breeders who are willing to donate a heifer to support the Junior raffle at the sale. The demand for good quality Hereford cattle is at an all time high, and the interest in the Sale has already been good. I encourage you all to consider consigning more than one animal to the sale, as more animals draw more interest and it helps keep our sale expense down. I would also ask that if at all possible, that you would try to get the best quality pictures and/or videos of your animals. It makes advertising a whole lot easier if we have some GOOD photos to work with. There are well qualified people out there that can help you with this, and maybe you could get together with some neighboring breeders and get several animals done on the same day. I encourage your input or any questions you may have, to either my-

self or any of the committee members.


